### PREPARING YOUR MINIATURE FOR ASSEMBLY AND PAINTING

Cleaning is optional, but it will provide better paint and glue adhesion. Use an old toothbrush and some warm water with 'washing up liquid' to gently brush the pieces clean (be extra careful of delicate pieces, so that you don't snap them). Make sure you rinse the parts afterwards and allow them to thoroughly air-dry.

#### BENDING

Resin is very detailed, yet sometimes thin parts may be bent slightly during transport or storage. It is simple to fix as resin has a "thermal memory" like a thermoplastic. It remembers the shape it was cast in. So simply run the part under a hot tap or use boiled water to heat and soften it. Then you can bend it carefully into shape.

#### TIDYING

Sometimes you will need to tidy up a part to ensure the best possible fit. Use some hobby clippers to snip off any sprues. Mould lines and flash may need to be scraped away with a file, or hobby knife.

## GLUING

To glue resin, you should use Super Glue Cyanoacrylate. If you rough up the surface of the bond with sandpaper you will get a stronger bond. If you glue your fingers you can use pineapple juice, or super glue remover.

Two part epoxy glue can be used on larger pieces.

# IMPORTANT

We recommend that children under the age of 14 years should be supervised by an adult when using sharp tools, or glue.
